REFLECTION ON TODAY'S READINGS - NOT HOW LONG; BUT HOW WELL

In the ideal business world, each is employed and rewarded according to the length of labour and probably, years of experience. But in the language of heaven, the pay is not based on the length of labour and energy but on grace. Those who started the faith (journey) early and have lived it for years and those who have come to the faith very late or towards the end of their years of life on earth, the Lord rewards all equally. He rewards each out of a heart of care: mercy is shown to the latecomers, a full wage; justice is shown to eager workers, a full wage. Our life in God is a demonstration of God's care and grace. As Christians, let us grow beyond the notion of being better than the other. We are all equal in the sight of God. When we try to prove that we are better than others we end up like these men. We should keep God's commandment not for show-off because, on the last day, we shall all stand one by one before God.


As always, our place in life affects how we hear Jesus' message. For people who are fully employed and well-paid in this life, this parable may be troubling. For those under- or unemployed, this Gospel reading may be wonderful news about who God is and how

For those of us who have enough in life, we may interpret this parable as about hard work and fairness. According to our values, those who work hard and long deserve more; they've earned it. We may find fault with those who weren't hired earlier in the

day, judging them as lazy or in some other way as moral failures. Notice, though, that nothing in Jesus' words suggest the workers hired later were "slackers" or lazy. They were "idle" because no one had hired them, not because they were hoping for a free handout.

This is a story about day laborers, an economic reality 2,000 years ago. This scene still plays out in Home Depot parking lots today. Day laborers, often undocumented immigrants and people of color, may stand around all day, not because they are lazy, but because there aren't enough people hiring. They are desperate to work to bring home food to their families or pay the rent. Without higher education, social connections, and the pure luck of being born in the right place at the right time, they have little choice but

to stand around all
